CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

This chapter focuses on the result of the analysis of the research entitled Swear Words Used in *Fast and Furious* Movie Series. The research concerns with the analysis of the kinds of swear words, the users of swear words and the purposes of uttering swear words. Hence, the researcher applies the theories and the method of research to analyze the data so that the conclusion can be drawn.

Based on Hughes's classifications, the result of the analysis shows that there are 135 data of swear words found in *Fast and Furious* movie series. Then, The data of swear words are divided into seven kinds which are classified as 1) Swear words related to sex (20 items), 2) Swear words related to excrement (51 items), 3) Swear words related to name of animal (13 items), 4) Swear words related to personal background (6 items), 5) Swear words related to sexual activity (4 items), 6) Swear words related to taboo or religion or oath (38 items) and 7) Swear words related to mental illness (3 items).

Moreover, the researcher categorizes the users of swear words based on Holmes's classifications. There are two aspects which influence the users of swear words. One of the factors is age. It is divided into swear words uttered by youngsters which consist of 117 data and swear words uttered by old generation which consist of 18 data. The other factor that influences the users of swear words is gender and occupation. It is divided into swear words uttered by men which consist of 121 data and swear words uttered by women which consist of 14 data.

Furthermore, the researcher describes the purposes of uttering swear words based on Eric Partridge's classifications. They are; 1) Swear words used to express anger which consists of 87 data, 2) Swear words used to degrade or put down which consists of 10 data, 3) Swear words used to express a response of shock which consists of 3 data, 4) Swear words used to express protest which consists of 9 data, 5) Swear words used to create intimacy which consists of 5 data and the last classification is 6) Swear words used to identify a certain profession which consists of 21 data.

In conclusion, swear words in *Fast and Furious* movie series are uttered by people who have different age, gender and occupation. Moreover, the kinds of swear words also refer to various purposes which influence the users to utter such swear words.
