CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the Study

Literature is closely related to life because it is the work of human being. In an Introduction to the Study of Literature, Hudson states that "Literature is a vital record of what men have seen in live. What they have thought and left about those aspects of it which have the most immediate and enduring interest for all of us"(1965:10). from everyday life. With his down-to-earth approach to his subjects, readers found it is easy to follow the poet into deeper truths, without being burdened with pedantry.

The writer chooses the Robert Frost's Poems entitled "Out, Out—"and "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening" because they are unique to discuss. Robert Frost in his poem entitled "Out Out—"tells about the fragility of human being, while in "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening", he describes about the loneliness. The writer chooses these poems because they have the same theme that shows the influence of humanity aspect such as the fragility of human being and loneliness. 1.2 Statements of the Problems

1.3 Limitation of the Problem
