CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSION

The objectives of the study entitled The Influence of Bertram's Family on the Main character's Life in Jane Austen's *Mansfield Park* are: (1) to know how are Bertram's family life (2) to analyze the influences of Bertram's family life on the main character's life named Fanny.

The writer does library research including Internet browsing to formulated the conceptual data that are used to find the data.
