CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

The research entitled "An Analysis of Predication used in the articles of Deutschland Magazine of September 2002" aims to describe the predication that is used in the Deutschland magazine of September 2002 and to know the position of subject in relation to predicate used in the articles of Deutschland magazine of September 2002. The data corpus used in this analysis consists of sentence and phrase.

The analysis of predication articles are resulting 17 (30%) number of the data included the predication with linking verb. It is classified into 3 structures; 9 (16%) data of the structure (noun) + linking verb+ noun, 1 (2%) data of the structure (noun) + linking verb+ adverb and 7 (12%) data of the structure (noun) + linking verb+ adjective. 21 (38%) number of the data included into the predication with intransitive verb. It is classified into 3 structure; 6 (11%) data of the structure (noun) + intransitive verb+ adverb and 7 (12%), (noun) + intransitive verb+ prepositional phrase. 18 (32%) number of the data included into the predication with transitive verb. It is classified into 4 structure; 9 (16%) data of the structure (noun) + transitive verb+ noun, 2 (4%) data of the structure (noun) + transitive verb+ noun, 4 (7%) data of the

structure (noun)+ transitive verb+ noun+ to/for phrase and 3 (5%) data of the structure (noun)+ transitive verb+ noun/ adjective.

The position of subject in relation to predicate is resulting 15 (58%) number of the data included into the subject-predicate in normal order and 9 (38%) number of the data included into the subject predicate are in inverted order. The position of subject-predicate in inverted order is classified into 3 position: 3 (13%) data of the subject-predicate in inverted order begins with the adverbial phrase, 2 (8%) data of the subject-predicate of question in inverted order, and 4 (16%) data of the inverted order with an expletive.

Finally, the writer hopes that the discussion in this thesis may provide a great contribution for better understanding on subject and predicate as the component of a structure of predication.
