CHAPTER I

Hornby (1987:876) in *Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary of Current English* says that a symbol is "sign, mark, and objects, looked upon us representing something." In the novel, symbols may show the reader about what happens in the story.

The symbols are important in literary work. They may represent the character's behavior or the character's action, but we can only observe them if we understand the text deeply (Kennedy, 1983:147). Symbols can also give a certain sense of the whole story of the novel. Symbols can be same things in the environment or simply words put in the work to symbolize something else that the readers have to able to catch the meaning.
