## **CHAPTER V**

## CONCLUSION

The research entitled Sex Aspects in the English Language Based on Perspective of English Magazines has purposes to describe about the term refers to man; the tem refers to woman, and the alternative term to neutralize both sexes into non sexist.

All of the data in this thesis are taken from The *Playboy* magazine, published monthly on February 1996, *Time* magazines published from December 2004 to January 2005, and *Newsweek* magazine published in November 2002. The total numbers of the data are 70 sentences.

In this thesis, there are three kinds of problems that are analyzed by the writer. Those are: the term that refers to man, the term that refers to woman, and the alternative term to neutralize both sexes into non sexist. Each kind of the problems may be classified in several parts such as: The term refers to man are categorized into two parts; the gender specific use of man and the generic terms. The term refers to woman, and the last kind is the alternative term to neutralize both sexes into non sexist divided into three kinds, they are: the use of the plural form, style-shifting and the last is substitution.

After the writer made such kind of analysis the writer made a conclusion that the terms that refers to man and woman are characterized by the use of personal pronoun *him*, *her*, and the specific terms that refer to both sexes such as *guys*, supporters, reporters, shoppers and so on. Language perception that indicates the

aspect of social participation. The social aspect here may involve the sex and gender distinctive roles fill in society.

The alternative terms to neutralize both sexes may be influence in the language perception for both sexes. In this case, the negative perception for both sexes or for the certain sex should be avoided to be non discriminatory. The writer substitutes the certain terms that indicate the sexist terms and use the alternative terms to neutralize both sexes in order to get the equal treatments for both sexes in society life; such as supposedly the sex linked traits, superior and inferior perceptions, the secondary position and so on. In this case, language may influence to avoid the inequalities of gender and also the gender differentiation, which happen in society life.

Language is more important to creates the balancing roles, sportive ness, neutralize sex and gender of both sexes and also avoid the sex discrimination even to avoid the violence of both sexes in their daily life.
