CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSION

In writing this thesis the writer takes a problem which happens in the stories, that is tragic love. Tragic love which is done by the main character in those two play, *Oedipus Rex* and *Sangkuriang*. The aims in the writing this thesis are to analyze the tragic love in *Oedipus Rex* and *Sangkuriang* and to analyze the similarities between *Oedipus Rex* and *Sangkuriang*.
