

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

The research entitled "*A Comparative Study of Phrasal Verb in English and Indonesian*" aims to describe the structure of English Phrasal Verb and to describe the similarities and the differences of phrasal verb in English and Indonesian. The data of phrasal verb is 40 data which taken from "Holland Horizon" magazine.

In "Holland Horizon" magazine there are three structures of phrasal verb that are used. From 40 data that are analyzed, there are 5 data (12, 5%) categorized as verb + preposition. The other data categorized as verb + adverbial particle (82, 5%), classified into 2 forms; separable (77, 5%) and inseparable (5%) and 2 of verb + adverb (5%). It seems that the structure of verb + adverbial particle is more frequently used than the other structure of phrasal verb.

The similarities between English and Indonesian Phrasal Verb show that the data have the same function as a predicate in the sentence. Besides that, English and Indonesian phrasal verb can produce a new different meaning after they are combined.

The differences between English and Indonesian phrasal verb show that both of them have some differences and they are based on the structure, that is, English phrasal verb can be combined with verb + preposition, verb + adverbial particle, verb + adverb, while, Indonesian phrasal verbs are made by the combination of verb + verb, verb + adjective and verb + adverb. The form in

English phrasal verb is separable and inseparable, but in Indonesian is inseparable only.

The existence of phrasal verb can make a sentence more various. It means that phrasal verb can complete or give an additional meaning to the word in a sentence.

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
