CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

The research entitled "An Analysis of Participial Phrase Construction In Articles Of Holland Horizon Magazine" aims to solve the problems of the study, they are; how are the structures of participial phrases used in articles of Holland Horizon magazine, what are the functions of participial phrases used in articles of Holland Horizon magazine, and what are the kinds of participial phrases used in articles of Holland Horizon magazine. The objectives of the study are to describe the structures of participial phrases used in article of Holland Horizon magazine, to describe the functions of participial phrases used in articles of Holland Horizon magazine, and to describe the kinds of participial phrases used in articles of Holland Horizon magazine. The data collected by population and sample. Then, the data corpus used in this analysis consists of sentence, phrase, participle and participial phrase.

The analysis of participial phrase construction of *Holland Horizon* magazine's article is resulting 28 of present participial phrase (56%), classified into 2 structures; "present participle + modifier + complement" (36%) and "present participle + modifier" (20%). 22 of past participial phrase (44%), classified into 2 structures; "past participle + modifier + complement" (18%) and "past participle + modifier" (26%).

The structures of participial phrases are also divided into present and past participial phrases. Both of kinds of participial phrases have function. The functions can be divided into two functions, they are: The function as subjective complement is resulting 38 of participial phrase (76%), including present and past participial phrases. The function as subjective complement can be seen through the positions of participial phrase. The positions are; at the beginning of sentence, in the middle of sentence and at the end of sentence. The function as objective complement is resulting 12 of participial phrase (24%), including present and past participial phrases. Participial phrases that function as objective complement take place at the end of a sentence only. The kinds of participial phrase are divided into two kinds; restrictive participial phrase (28%) and nonrestrictive participial phrase (52%).

The conclusion is that the existence of participial phrase can make a sentence more various. It means that participial phrase can complete or give an additional meaning to the word in a sentence.

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
