The jargon referring to beverage	Sentoran, oplosan.
The jargon referring to person	Genthong, bandhar.
The jargon referring to food	Terambule, RW, 02.

Now, we can see that there are several jargons of drunkard used by the drunkards on Wonoasri Road.
